This course is an opportunity for those beginning photographers who mastered their technical skills related to photography and are interested in exploring the medium further. The reason why this course is being offered is that photography is a wide medium that may be expressed through multiple genres and for this reason; in particular, students should have the opportunity to explore different photographic genres whilst also attempting to define their own styles and niche. This programme will replace the non-accredited unit.

The rationale behind this course is to guide students who already demonstrate a good basic understanding of photography and its techniques but would like to improve the level of their photographic skills and competencies to a higher standard. This course will introduce students to different photographic genres and their different requirements in the work industry.						
Ultimately, this course will also support students in producing a series of photographs depicting a theme or narrative, professionally editing their work and finally being able to present their work in front of an audience whilst explaining their conceptual project.

This unit will be delivered at MQF Level 4 with a total of 4 ECTs. Total learning hours will add up to 100 hours – 26 hours will cover unit guided learning hours (including lecturing, practical sessions and workshop tutorials), the other 74 hours will cover unit self-study hours (including portfolio developing, research, reading, etc.), additionally, these 74 hours will also include working on an assignment and continuous feedback by the tutor.

The Unit guided learning hours part of the course will be delivered on a face-to-face basis at the MCAST ICA; thus, lessons will be delivered through several practical lessons where students may practice the theory learnt. Additionally, by the end of the course, lessons will also serve as a workshop, where students will be encouraged to work on their own series of photographs, edit them and, also, gather feedback from one another.

Furthermore, this course will be delivered over a period of 13 weeks – with a 2-hour lecture per week schedule.

Depending on the group of students, lessons may be held in Maltese/ English as, if needs be, instructions and demonstrations may also be delivered through language co-switching.

Photography jobs are increasingly being added on platforms like LinkedIn and Get Hitched, while requirements vary from events to commercial to wedding photography services. Consequently, this course would be highly beneficial for those beginning photographers who would like to expand their knowledge on different photographic genres and be able to use this medium's ability and be part of the professional photographic working industry.
